 Discover five fun activities below...
 How many can you complete over half term?

1. BREAKING NEWS

Watch or listen to a news report on TV, the radio or online. Think of an event that happened in your life today and write about it in the style of a news report. Make sure you clearly say what is **fact** and what is **opinion**. Include a quote from a key eyewitness. Can you present it at home in the style of a newsreader?

You'll need: news report, paper, pencil, imagination

2. THE BIG PICTURE

Small actions can add up to make a bigger picture. Make a picture of our planet using small dots or strokes (this is called pointillism). Draw or label some of your dots to represent positive actions people can take to make the world a better place.

You'll need: paper, pens, pencils, finger paints or chalk

5. BUILD IT BETTER

Re-design your street or area to make it better for the people who live there. Draw and label your design or craft a mini-model. What problems did you spot that could be improved or solved? **Level up:** Write to your local representative and share your ideas.

You'll need: paper, pens / pencils, (optional) your choice of craft materials

4. PEOPLE POWER

Think about an issue that's important to you in the world or in your local area. Make a poster or video to raise awareness of this issue. Try to include one simple thing your audience can do today that can help.
